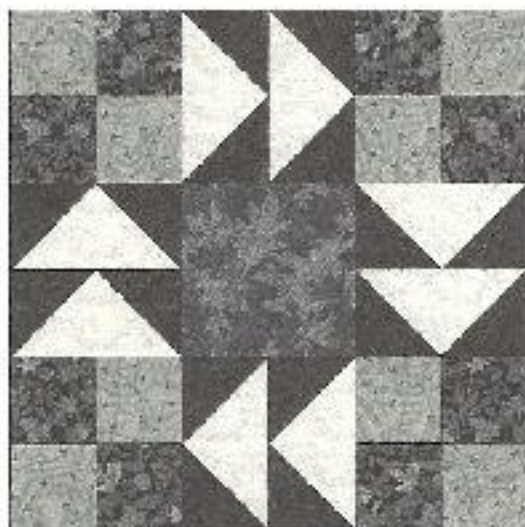
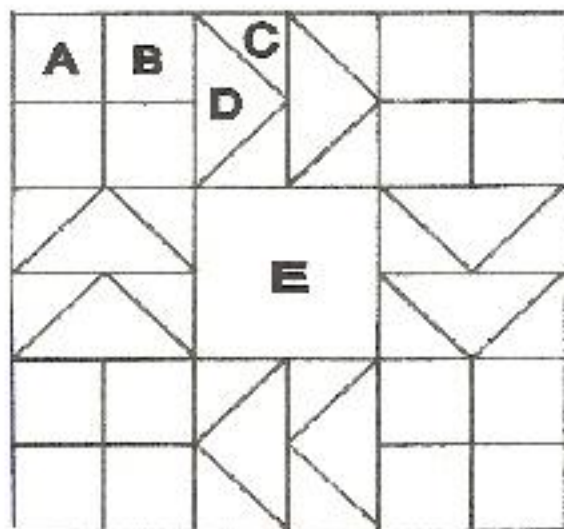


Flying Geese Circling *October Block of the Month*



I came up with this block on my EQ6 computer program. I got the idea of flying geese based from a block I saw on www.quiltercache.com website, Evening Migration. When I think of October, I think of geese migrating South.

The only requirement for this block is to use fall fabrics and fall colors. I have included a paper piece pattern for the flying geese if you prefer this method or you can do the rotary cutting method.



Cutting

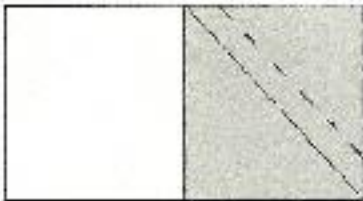
A cut 8-2 1/2" square

B cut 8-2 1/2" square

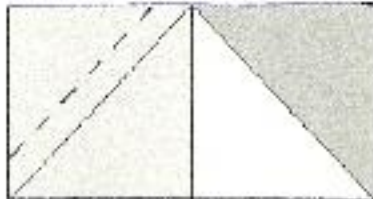
C cut 16-2 1/2" square

D cut 8-2 1/2" x 4 1/2" square

E cut 1-4 1/2" square



With a pencil draw a line corner to corner on the background fabric of block C. Place block C over block D and sew on the diagonal line. Leave a 1/4" seam and cut off remaining fabric. Press seams open. Repeat 7 times.



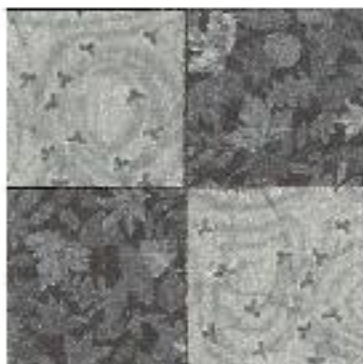
Repeat previous step above on other side of block D to form flying geese unit.



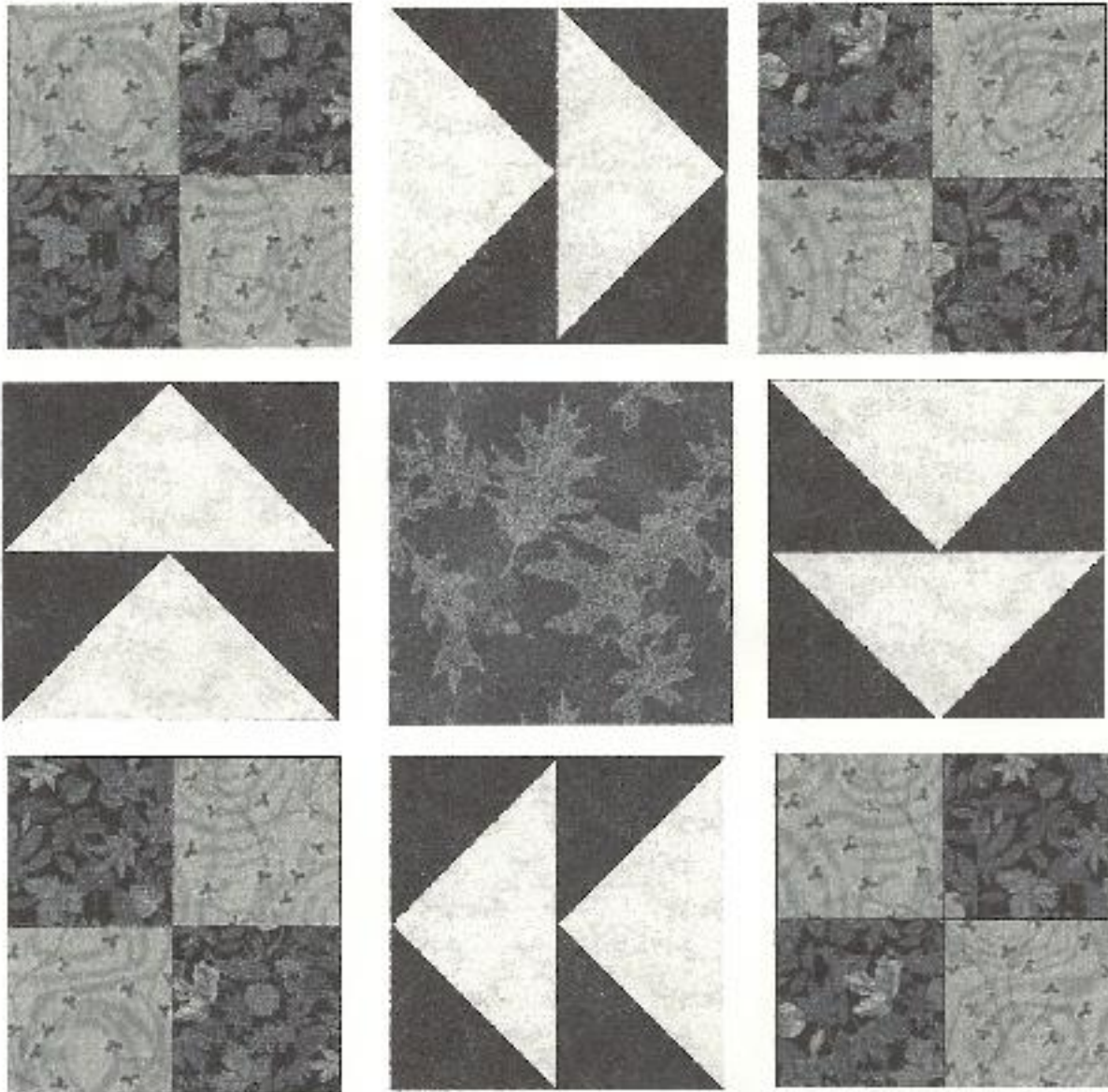
Sew two of the flying geese together to form the block unit. Press seams open. Repeat 3 more times.



Sew block A and block B together. Press seams open. Repeat 7 times.



Sew two of the previous sections together to form block. Repeat 3 more times. Press seams open.



Sew sections together as shown. Press seams open.

Block measures 12 1/2 " square.
